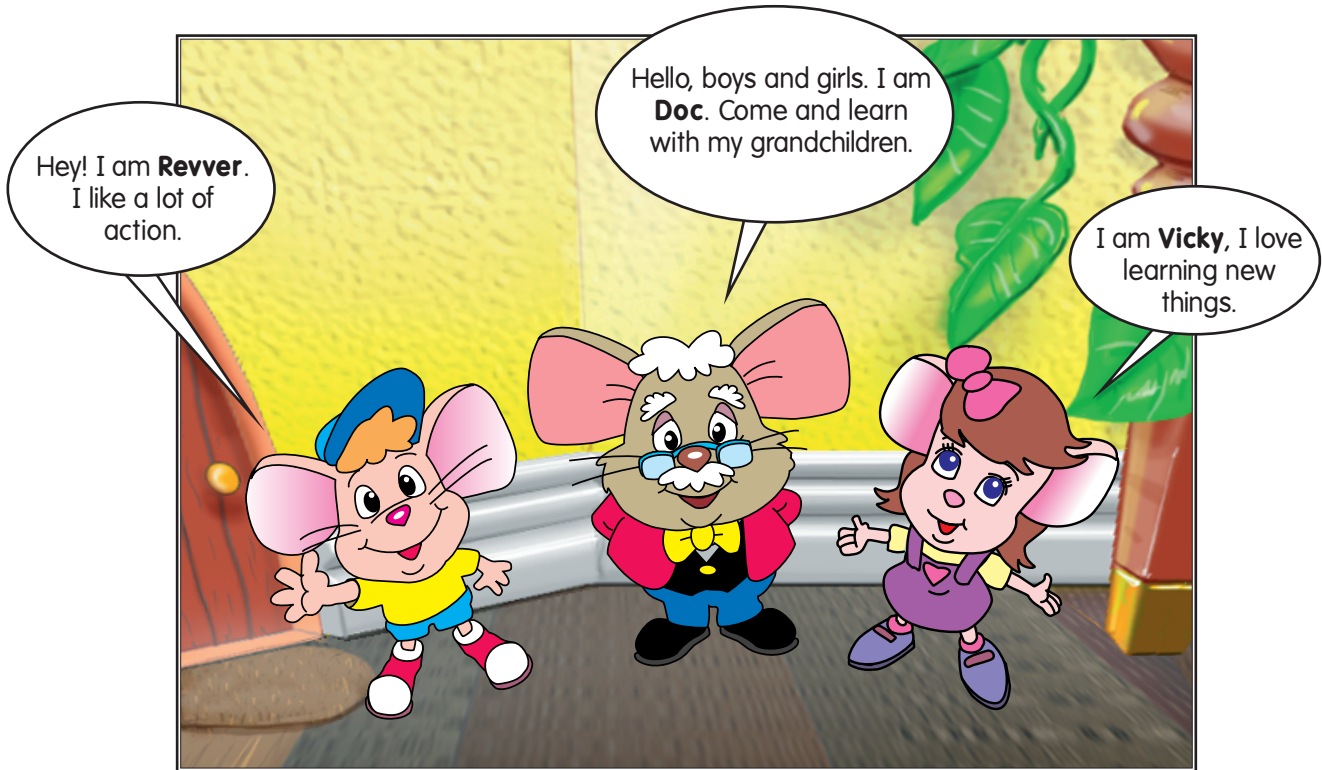

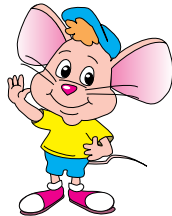

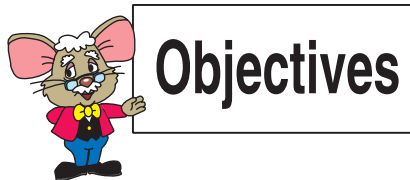

preserve (pri zèrv'). Keep safe.

prophecy (prof' u sē). Telling about something that will happen before it happens.

prophet (prof' it). Someone who tells what will happen.

reveal (ri vĕl'). To make known.

sacrifice (sak' ru fīs). An offering.

shepherd (shép' urd). Someone who takes care of sheep.

stable (stā bul). A place to keep horses, cows, or farm animals.

tablet (tab' lit). Something to write on.

talent (tal' unt). Something that one can do very well.

tomb (tüm). A place to put people when they die.

valuable (val' yù u bul). Very special.

vision (vizh' un). Something seen in one's mind.

wisdom (wiz' dum). Being wise.

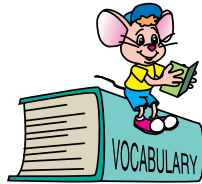
worship (wĕr' ship). Love and praise given to God.
