# Poetry

Poems are written words that show strong emotions and imagination. They match carefully chosen words with feelings.

Poems are around us everywhere. Songs, TV or radio ads, books, cards, and the Bible have poems.

There are many different kinds of poems. Some poems have rhyming words. Some poems follow a special pattern. Some poems have **rhythm**. Some poems have phrases. Some poems have complete sentences. Some poems are written in a special shape. Writing and reading poems allows you to use your **imagination**.

Do you remember this poem from Unit 1?

## “Reading”

Reading sets my imagination free.  
I can learn about the world around me.  
Stories about people of long ago,  
Finding things I did not know.  
Exploring countries from a book,  
Reading a recipe to help me cook.  
Getting today’s news from story headlines,  
Gathering information from road signs.  
Isn’t it wonderful that I can see  
The exciting world reading gives to me?

This poem has strong feelings about reading. This poem has five verses, or **stanzas**. A verse or a stanza is a special group of lines in a poem. A stanza is like a paragraph in a story. Each verse of the poem has two lines. These two lines are called a **couplet**. Do you see the word “couple” in the word couplet? Couple means two. The word couplet means two lines of poetry with rhyming words at the end of the lines.



“Two lines of rhyme are fun to **read**.  
And that is all that couplets **need**.”

Songs are actually poems that have music with them. Read the words from the song “Jesus Loves Me.” There are some rhyming words in the song. There are couplets in this song.
