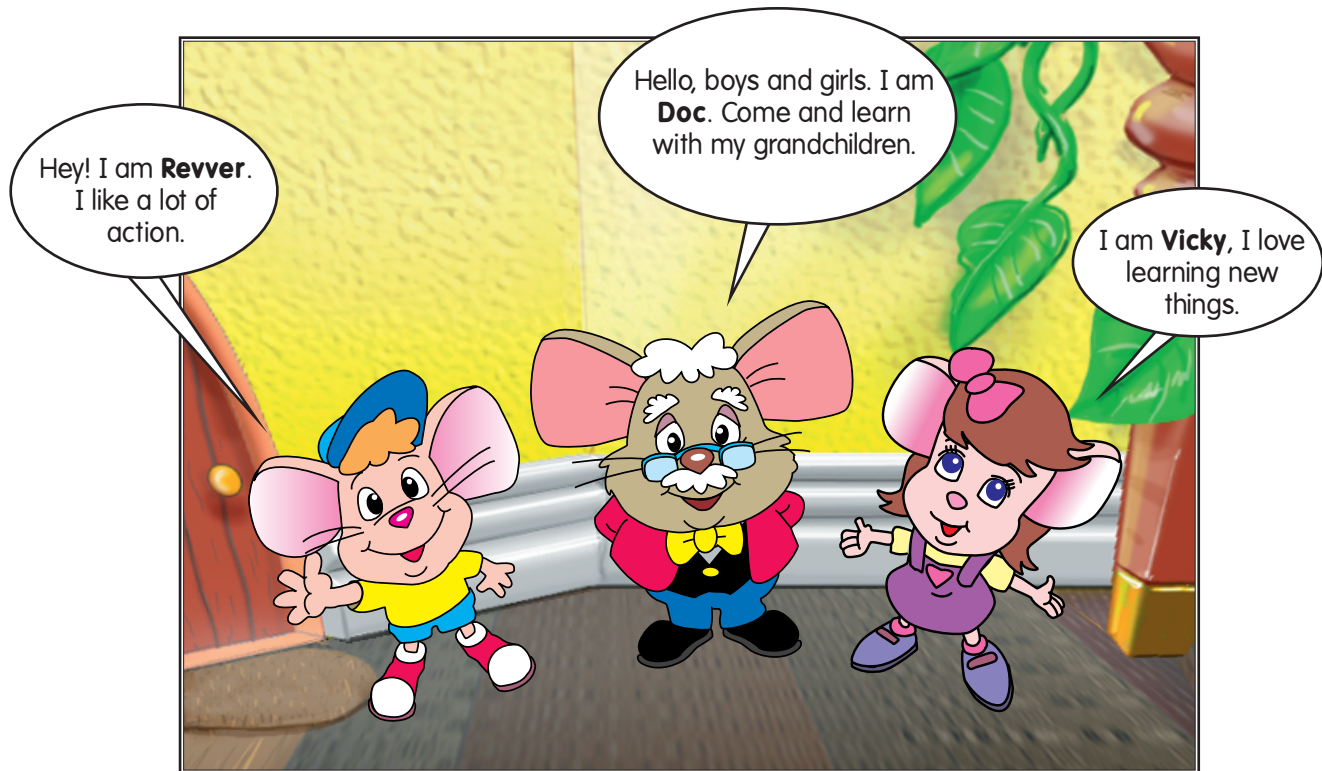

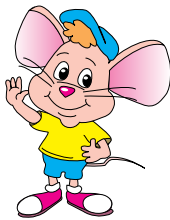

adjective (ad jec tive). The word that tells about a noun. An adjective answers the questions: Which one? What kind? How many?

adverb (ad verb). A word that tells about a verb. An adverb answers the questions: How? When? Where?

exclamation mark (ex cla ma tion mark). The mark (!) at the end of a sentence to show surprise or excitement.

fleece The wool that covers a sheep.

irregular (ir reg u lar). Something that does not follow the rules.

noun A word that names a person, place, or thing.

period (per i od). The mark (.) at the end of a sentence that tells something.

pronounce (pro nounce). To speak.

pronunciation (pro nun ci a tion). Making the sounds of words.

question mark (ques tion mark). The mark (?) at the end of a sentence that asks a question.

smashed To break into pieces.

sword A weapon with a long, sharp blade.

torch A light to be carried about.

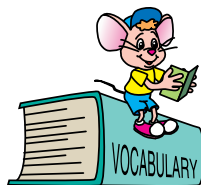
trumpet (trum pet). A musical instrument that has a powerful tone.

verb A word that tells our state of being or what someone is doing.
